Identify sensitive profiles

Gain insight into the patient's work, hobbies, and lifestyle. Identify those who have professions requiring high visual demands, frequently drive at night, or are sensitive to low light conditions.

- Do you drive frequently at night?
- Are you particularly concerned about night vision?
- Have you noticed halos before?

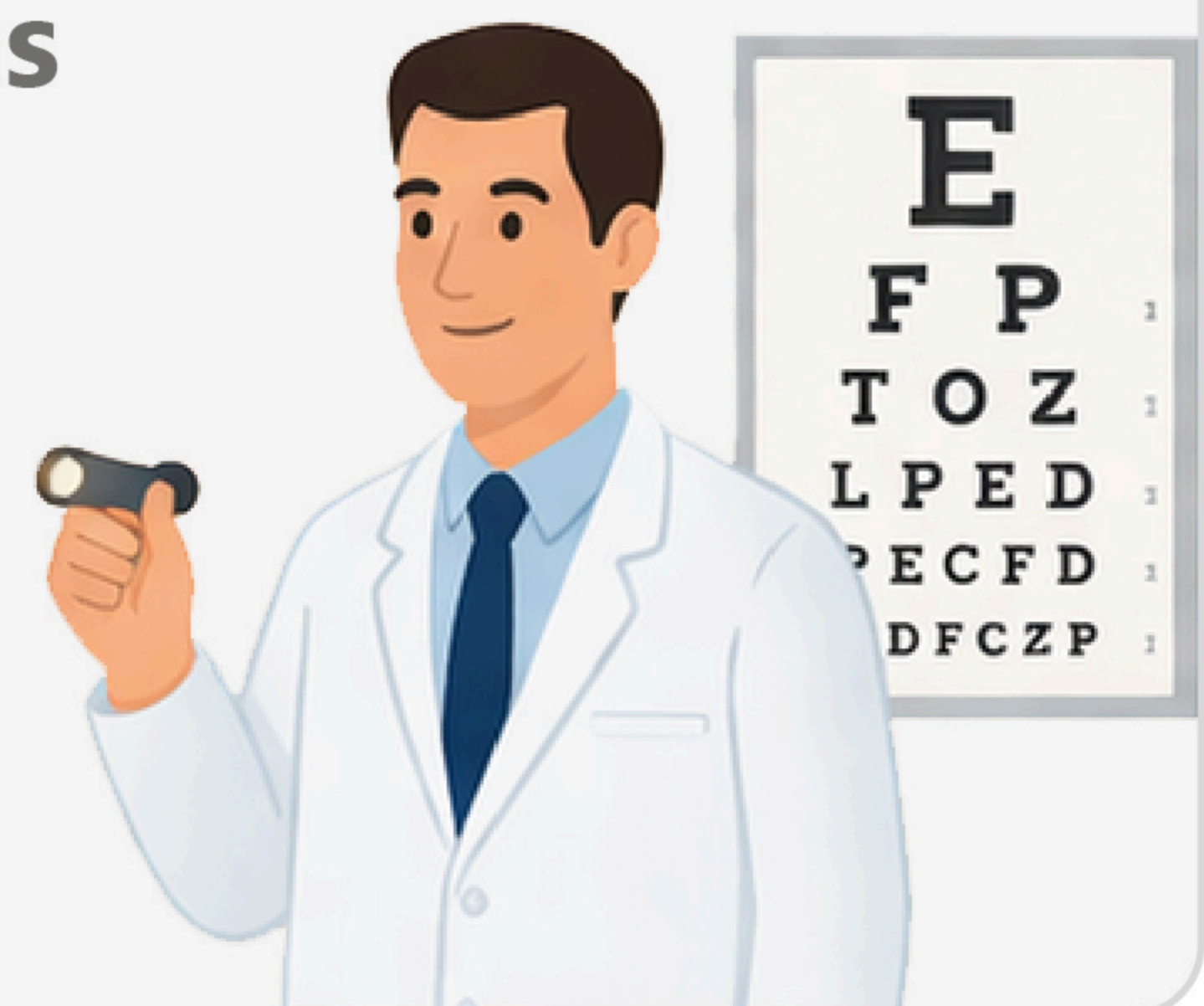

Recognize emotional reactions

Address the patient's concern and be ready to differentiate an emotional reaction from true optical phenomena.

- Are you worried about halos at night?
- Do halos cause you anxiety?
- Do you think halos would disturb your life activities?

Replace imagination with experience

Visual simulation technologies such as SimVis Gekko reduce uncertainty and allow patients to experience halo vision before surgery, helping them gain confidence in the treatment.
